There is a great possibility the WZOO carrier was left on the air overnight (July 13- July 14) due to technical failure. When the morning operator arrived at the station at 5:30am (July 14) he noticed the meters were all reading their normal position for when the station is on the air. Upon inspection none of the indicators that show the transmitter is operating were lighted. He attempted to shut the transmitter down and it took several pushes of the "off" button to make that happen. At the authorized "sign on" time of 6:15 the operator had to push the "on" button several times to get the meters to show the carrier was on. There are currently no "on air" lights working on the front of the transmitter. The operator who shut down the station last evening (July 13) is a reliable person and he has indicated he turned the carrier off as he has done countless times in the past.
